Methodology

BATTLEGROUND WEB POLL, WEIGHTED TO PHONE POLL

SEPTEMBER BATTLEGROUND WEB POLL: A 1,200 sample web survey of registered voters in a 16-state battleground was conducted online September 22-27, 2020 from a voter-file sample. 726 respondents were being interviewed for the 3rd as part of the CVI/DCorps ongoing panel in the battleground.

The registered voter web surveys are voter-file matched to produce a high-quality samples of real voters with the added advantage of known vote history. They are also well-suited for conducting experiments to test message strategies and executions.

WEIGHTING TO PHONE POLLS: A phone poll of 1,000 registered voters in this 16-state battleground was conducted by phone September 22-27, 2020 from a voter-file sample. 67% of respondents were reached on cell phones in order to accurately reflect the American electorate. The margin of error is +/- 3.5 percentage points.

- The phone survey includes core demographic and ideological questions, including key thermometer measures, and is used to compare and apply political and cultural weights the web survey results to offset bias of online sample.
- Only with such a survey can we properly weight our web surveys, which we know are often biased to be culturally liberal and more educated.

<u>8 Blue Wall States</u> = IA (+3), MI (+1), ME (+3), MN (+1), NH (-), OH (+3), PA (-), WI (-)

- Northeast (ME, NH, PA),
- Midwest (IA, MI, MN, OH, WI)
- South (FL, GA, NC, VA)

Biden in formidable position. Why?


- The death of Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg & Trump's Senate confirmation battle has backfired: it is the Democratic base that is newly enraged and engaged, worried about loss of Roe v Wade and ACA.
- Biden visibly campaigning for white working-class voters in the Rust Belt was heard: the men did move closer to 2016's level of Trump support but came to mid-term level; Biden's women's vote is stable at 43 percent.
- Democrats have consolidated every Democrat primary voter: Sanders voters, but now matched by those who supported other candidates.
- GOP fractures becoming more visible with 17 percent GOP defectors who say they used to be Republicans until a few years ago and 7 percent dual haters. Biden is winning the lion's share of both groups.

The Senate acting on SCOTUS nomination inflamed Democrats, Black voters, and women base






Trump's SC appointment pushed voters to Biden by 13 points — with 10-point gap in intensity




Stable strong Biden lead - joined by House and Senate gains


Blue wall very strong in Midwest and East, narrowed in South and very close in West

Critically, Biden's white blue-collar vote more than stabilized; men back to mid-terms and women holding with 43 percent of the vote



Biden gained from total Democratic consolidation — both Sanders voters and those who supported other primary candidates



Biden gains driven by Blacks & white unmarried women – with still impressive results across RAE and white college women


